

# The PEOPLE Programme

#### **Overall objective:**

To raise the number of high qualified researchers in the European Research Area!!!

- Transnational mobility is often an important precondition for excellence
   makes the access to expertise independent from the country of origin
- **> Budget**: 4.750 million €
- ➤ Budget increase of ~ 50% compared to FP6



# **PEOPLE supports:**

- > Training and career development of researchers
- > Transnational and transsectoral research experience
- > Bottom-up programme: no thematic requirements / specifications
- Graduation required! Students can not be funded
- No age limit!

- 1) Initial Training Networks (ITN)
- 2) Industry-Academia Partnerships and Pathways (IAPP)
- 3) International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)
- 4) Researchers' Night (NIGHT)
- 5) Co-funding of Fellowship Programmes (COFUND)

Individual Driven Actions
For researcher together with host organisation

- Intra-European Fellowships (IEF)
- 2) International Outgoing Fellowships (IOF)
- 3) International Incoming Fellowships (IIF)
- 4) Career Integration Grant (CIG)



# International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)

- Long term research cooperation with third countries:
  - In the frame of the European Neighbourhood policy
  - With S&T agreement countries
- > Joint research-/staff exchange project
- Knowledge transfer through short term exchange of research staff and networking activities (conferences, workshops etc.)
- > 2-4 years duration

**ATTENTION:** Enterprises are not eligible for this MC Action!!!



#### **The Consortium**

- > At least three participating research organisations:
  - two organisations from different EU-/Associated Countries
  - one organisation from an eligible third country
- > Average size of the consortium in submitted projects: 5-6 participants
- > Range: 3-27 participants
- > Enterprises are not eligible!!!

#### Staff secondment



- Researchers (early stage and experienced), technical and R&D management staff
- Exchange only between EU-/AC-country ↔ third country
- ▶ Balanced exchange EU-/AC-countries ↔ third countries
- Duration of secondment: max. 12 months (split stays possible)
- Staff is seconded (salary is paid by their institution of origin) and have the right to return

## **Funding**



- > For seconded staff from Europe and ICPC:
  - 1.900 € / staff member / month
  - + 200 € / staff member / month if long distance ICPC
- Funding is intended to cover travel and subsistence costs, networking activities, management costs and overheads
- Organisations from non-ICPC are expected to provide their own funding for the secondment of staff to Europe
- Average requested budget: ca. 160.000 € Range: 13.000 - 1.044.000 €
- Often rather small projects with a few hundred thousand budget
